



European frog-bit is a free-floating aquatic invasive species that looks like a miniature water lily with smaller, quater-sized leaves. Flowers are white with 3 petals and a yellow center.

HOW DOES IT IMPACT ME?

European frog-bit can quickly cover the surface of your pond or lake, reducing the amount of oxygen available to fish, frogs and other aquatic inhabitants. Additionally, it can clog irrigation and filtration pipes and make movement difficult for fish or boats.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?

- 1). Allow project partners to survey ponds and wetlands on your property to look for frog-bit. You do not need to be present during the survey. COVID-19 prevention measures will be followed by field crews.
- 2). Always Clean, Drain and Dry your boat, waders, and gear to prevent the spread of aquatic invaders like European frog-bit: stopaquatichitchhikers.org
- 3). Keep an eye out for any new invasive species and report them to the CISMA (248-660-0716; oaklandcountycisma@gmail.com)
